

In particular, using the [COVID-19 Pre-Event Questionnaire](#) and working with your Chartered Organization so they know about your activities (usually providing your Chartered Organization Representative a calendar of activities, especially the ones that involve some face-to-face interaction and having him or her signing off on the calendar to approve the activities.

If someone ends up testing positive for COVID-19 after an activity, the information on the questionnaire will be sought to determine if enough precaution was used in holding the event and for possible contact tracing.

Muir District's *One and Only* Member of the Inaugural Class of Female Eagle Scouts

Congratulations to **Makaylla Tompkins-Nutt** on passing her Eagle Scout Board of Review on January 28, 2021 (officially February 8, 2021 as per National's policy regarding the Inaugural Class of Female Eagle Scouts)! The members of the Inaugural Class were recognized and celebrated during the Boy Scouts of America's [Be The Change](#) virtual event on February 21, 2021.



"For more than 110 years, Scouts have been a positive change in their communities, building a legacy of servant leadership and making a difference in the world. Every year, thousands of these Scouts earn the Eagle Scout Award, the pinnacle rank in the Scouts BSA program. This year, young women joined the prestigious ranks of the more than 2.5 million Eagle Scouts who have earned the award since the first in 1912. It's a difficult road to reach the Eagle Scout rank, with about 4% to 8% of all Scouts earning it during any given year. This year's class of Eagle Scouts, including hundreds of young women, was a particularly driven and resourceful group, forced to lead their peers, earn merit badges, and plan and carry out service projects in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic." - excerpt from *Special Edition February 2021 of Scout Life: Saluting the Inaugural Class of Female Eagle Scouts*.

Makaylla is a part of history by being a member of nearly 1,000 (actual number: 933) members of the Inaugural Class, by breaking barriers, and being an inspiration for aspiring Eagle Scouts!

National Statement on COVID-19

As always, the safety of our Scouts, volunteers, employees and communities is our top priority.

Our response to the COVID-19 pandemic continues to be informed by expertise from agencies, including the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

We expect that everyone in Scouting will follow the guidelines listed below, which are based on the CDC's guidance. In addition, we have instructed local councils to consult with their local and state health departments, as well as local chartered partners, in order to implement appropriate protocols to help keep members, volunteers, and employees safe.

- Isolate if you are sick, and do not attend any activity/meeting/event if you, anyone you live with, or anyone you have recently been around feels unwell.
- Stay at least 6 feet apart from people who do not live with you. (properly executed Scouting cohorts at council camps may be an exception).
- Avoid crowds.
- Avoid poorly ventilated indoor spaces.
- Meet outside if you can.
- Wear a face covering or mask that covers your nose and mouth to help protect yourself and others.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water. Use hand sanitizer if soap and water are not available.
- Avoid international travel if possible.
- Do not attend any activity/meeting/event if you or anyone you live with has been tested for COVID-19 or another illness and do not have the results back yet.


Units should look to their council regarding whether/how to conduct in-person meetings and activities. If in-person gatherings are permitted, be sure to follow all applicable guidelines and use your council's version of the Pre-Event Medical Screening Checklist before attending.

We are taking similar steps as a national organization as we continue to evaluate and adapt to the current environment with the best interests of our members, volunteers, and employees in mind.

Thank you for doing your part to ensure that young people continue to benefit from Scouting while protecting the health and safety of our families, friends, and communities.







Congratulations to the Newest Muir Eagle Scouts!

- Makaylla Tompkins-Nutt, T484G, 1/28/2021 (2/08/2021 official date as a member of the *Inaugural Class of Female Eagle Scouts*).
 - Project Name: "Kaylla's Positivity Garden Project".
 - Project Description: The scout used GoFundMe for fundraising. The project had three products, plus installation. The first product including washing, priming, painting and positive designs on stones, and adults spray sealing 120 stones, using safety equipment, to help children develop a positive mindset and encourage good self esteem. The painted stones were placed in groups around the campus. The second product included construction of 3 rolling planters, for use in teaching Botany. The third product of the project was painting, spray sealing by adults using safety equipment, and installation of 10 positive message plaques on both existing

and new planters. COVID-19 solutions: Workers painting plaques and stones worked in family groups at home. The scout gave detailed instructions in writing and by zoom. Workers texted photos of their plaques and stones in process and completed to the scout. Builders and installers worked in family groups, were temperature tested, kept masked, and worked 6 feet apart.

- Tyler Barazoto, T444, 2/04/2021.
 - Project Name: "Trap Shooting Booths".
 - Project Description: Design and construction of three scoring booths for their skeet/trap shooting fields. Current booths have seats with no back, and a table attached, for scoring. The new booths have been carefully constructed to provide a bench, a table for scoring, storage beneath the seat for the scorekeeper's lunch, etc., 3 walls, and a roof, mounted on highly durable wheels. The back wheels pivot, for ease of maneuvering the booths. The roof provides sun and rain protection for the scorekeepers. The new booths are more comfortable and more substantial. The project also included creating and using a COVID-19 questionnaire, holding a fundraiser at the scout's place of employment, and using GoFundMe to receive donations.
