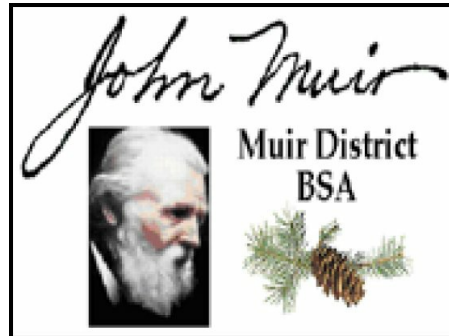

This note is for all Cubmasters, Scoutmasters, Skippers, Committee Chairs, District Committee Members, Commissioners, and other interested leaders in Muir District.

General Interests:

The chart gives the quick and dirty version of the format of allowable activities by county while the material above the chart cites the source material guidelines to generate the chart. Friends of Scouting (FOS)—For families who can help others, we can use the help. Tax deductible donations will be used to subsidized event and activity fees (compare the cost of other summer camps to a Scouts BSA summer camp), help pay upkeep of camp properties, help to provide assistance from service centers, seeds a registration-assistance fund, and more as detailed in a 2.5-minute video at [FOS video](#) . Every family should have the opportunity to participate in FOS if they can. Your unit may have a campaign facilitated by a parent, a presentation facilitated by a district leader, or a letter campaign. Please contact Alan at alan.young@scouting.org to tell your preference. Secure on-line donations may be made at <https://ggacbsa.org/donate/> . Patches are available for pledges at the \$100 and \$240 levels and paid by the end of 2021.

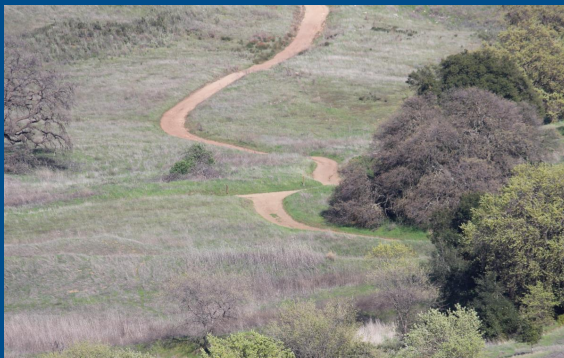
Muir Scouts being Active and Safe!

National Statement on COVID-19

As always, the safety of our Scouts, volunteers, employees and communities is our top priority.

Our response to the COVID-19 pandemic continues to be informed by expertise from agencies, including the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

We expect that everyone in Scouting will follow the guidelines listed below, which are based on the CDC's guidance. In addition, we have instructed local councils to consult with their local and state health departments, as well as local chartered partners, in order to implement appropriate protocols to help keep members, volunteers, and employees safe.

- Isolate if you are sick, and do not attend any activity/meeting/event if you, anyone you live with, or anyone you have recently been around feels unwell.
- Stay at least 6 feet apart from people who do not live with you. (properly executed

Scouting cohorts at council camps may be an exception).

- Avoid crowds.
- Avoid poorly ventilated indoor spaces.
- Meet outside if you can.
- Wear a face covering or mask that covers your nose and mouth to help protect yourself and others.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water. Use hand sanitizer if soap and water are not available.
- Avoid international travel if possible.
- Do not attend any activity/meeting/event if you or anyone you live with has been tested for COVID-19 or another illness and do not have the results back yet.

Units should look to their council regarding whether/how to conduct in-person meetings and activities. If in-person gatherings are permitted, be sure to follow all applicable guidelines and use your council's version of the [Pre-Event Medical Screening Checklist](#) before attending.

We are taking similar steps as a national organization as we continue to evaluate and adapt to the current environment with the best interests of our members, volunteers, and employees in mind.

Thank you for doing your part to ensure that young people continue to benefit from Scouting while protecting the health and safety of our families, friends, and communities.

SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENT NEW COVID-19 GUIDANCE FOR ALL COUNTIES IN GOLDEN GATE AREA COUNCIL FINALLY HERE.

New COVID-19 web page on GGAC website: <https://ggacbsa.org/covid/>.

This web page is constantly being updated to ensure compliance with ever changing local health orders and guidances. Near the bottom of this web page contains a chart of each county, their tier level regarding COVID-19 restrictions, and the current status of each event.

Note: the term "Hybrid" activity has been interpreted by the Council as "that all classroom portions of the trainings will be conducted online and that the outdoor practical portions will be conducted outdoors in compliance with all regulations."

In addition, for events that are not trainings, Hybrid is referred to as an option for both in-person and virtual. Safety remains the top priority so Chartered Organizations and parents may choose how youth will participate based on their concerns. As always, *please review the latest local health orders/guidance* and consult with your District Professional if you have any questions/inquiries.

Lastly, please remember that if an activity is marked as "In Person" or "Hybrid", the number of people who may participate in the activity is based on the State Cohort Gatherings guidance. Currently (at the date of this newsletter; March 24, 2021) *Contra Costa County's restrictions* limit Cohort activities to 14 youth and 2 supervising adults (no more than 16 individuals total in a cohort). Scouting activities **do not count** as Private Gatherings. Please contact GGAC VP of Risk Management Don Kubik: don.kubik@kubikehs.com for more details.

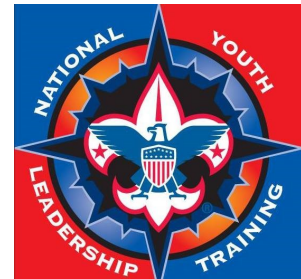

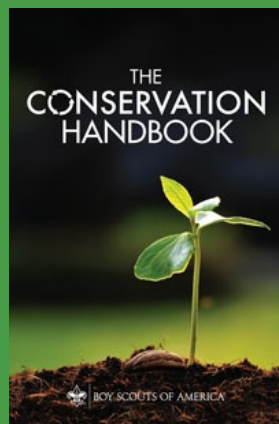

HAZARDOUS WEATHER TRAINING

Please take or update your training before your first outdoor or camping activity.

Since April 2018, BSA has required adult volunteer direct-contact leaders in all outdoor programs to take the most up-to-date (April 2018) *Hazardous Weather Training* (SCO_800). This training is [available online](#).

- Cub Scouting (Cubmaster, Assistant Cubmaster, Den Leader, Assistant Den Leader)
- Scouts BSA (Scoutmaster, Assistant Scoutmaster)
