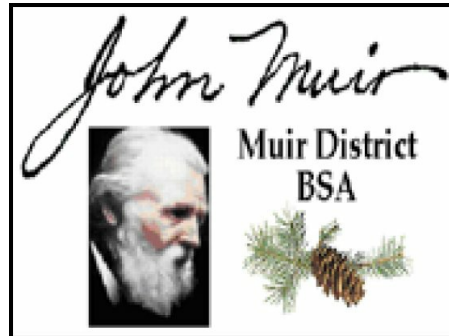

Scouts, Are They Still Around?!—It seems odd hearing this response after you tell someone that you are involved in the Scouting program. Sometimes we are our own worst enemy at promoting the positive aspects of what we do. This summer is an opportunity to change this in a large-picture way (by all means, we should be relaying this type of information to community newspapers and other local news media) through the Summer of Service. This is a planning and tracking program for service projects done by families. Eagle Service Project Service Hours--Are your Eagle Scouts proud of their service projects? Want to help spread the word about good things that Scouts are doing for the community? We are trying to identify the number of service hours provided through these service projects. Scouts (or leaders) and Scouters may enter particulars about their projects completed in the Bay Area. Thank you, Karen Hansen for listing some of the recent projects!

Friends of Scouting (FOS)—For families who can help others, we can use the help. 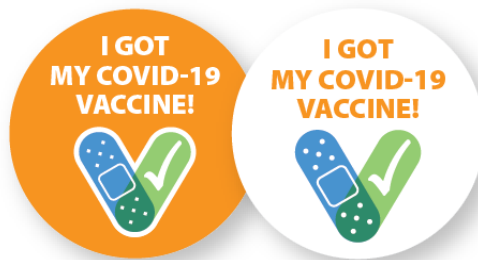

One of the largest induction ceremonies held by either Achewon Nimat, Kaweah or Ut-in Selica Lodges. Special thanks to the cook crew that provided a COVID safe dining experience.

"The Vigil Honor is the highest honor that the Order of the Arrow can bestow upon its members for service to lodge, council, and Scouting. Membership cannot be won by a person's conscious endeavors.

The Vigil Honor is a high mark of distinction and recognition reserved for those Arrowmen who, by reason of exceptional service, personal effort, and unselfish interest, have made distinguished contributions beyond the immediate responsibilities of their position of office to one or more of the following:

- Lodge
- Order of the Arrow
- Scouting community
- Scout Camp

Under no circumstances should tenure in Scouting or the Order of the Arrow be considered as reason enough for a Vigil Honor recommendation.

Any member of the Order of the Arrow registered in Scouting and in good standing in a regularly chartered lodge is eligible for recommendation to the National Order of the Arrow Committee for elevation to the Vigil Honor provided that, at the time of the recommendation, the individual has been a Brotherhood member for a minimum of two years. A lodge may nominate a maximum of two percent of their registered Arrowmen once a year, through the Vigil Honor petition. At least 50 percent of all nominated must be under 21 at the time of nomination."

Important Information for Summer Camp 2021

Editor's Note:

The email (which has been converted to a pdf link) above was sent to *all registrants* of GGAC Summer Camp 2021 based off the Black Pug registration system. Some of the people who receive this email will include those who may have had an error receiving their email OR did not register for Summer Camp this year. **However, there is important information about COVID-19 protocols**, what you would need to bring, and conditions for Campers and Drivers to be permitted to camp such as acceptable negative COVID-19 tests (within 72 hours of arrival to camp OR proof of COVID-19 vaccination (copy is permitted)).

When you completed the adult leader application to officially join Scouting, one of the eight "leader requirements" you agreed to meet was this one: "Abide by the Scout Oath, Scout Law and Scouter Code of Conduct."

You probably have those first two memorized. But the Scouter Code of Conduct? That code, which we first blogged about in 2017, is a list of 10 things that, as Scouters, we agree to do our best to do.

When you review the list of 10 below, you shouldn't find any surprises there. The Scouter Code of Conduct is just about using the BSA's program as designed, including all of the program features designed to protect youth from harm, abuse or trauma.

In the years since we first covered the code, it has been updated to reflect the BSA's introduction of SAFE, an acronym to help Scouts and Scouters remember which safety points they should incorporate into any activity, including service projects. SAFE, which we blogged about in March, stands for:

- Supervision
- Assessment
- Fitness and Skill

- Equipment and Environment

Use These Updated Forms to Support a SAFE Scouting Experience.

Prior to any service projects, use the [SAFE Service Project Planning Checklist](#) and simplified [SAFE Project Tool Use Guidelines](#).

The safety of our Scouts, volunteers, employees, and communities is our top priority. This checklist can be used for all Scouting service projects (Order of the Arrow, Distinguished Conservation Service Award, Eagle Scout, and individual or unit service). The checklist is not an added requirement for an Eagle Scout service project.

The guidelines document outlines several minimum guiding protocols that adult leaders and other volunteers must consider for Scouting service projects that include the use of tools. It is not intended to cover the use of tools integrated into advancement requirements (i.e., merit badges, handbooks, or adventures).

- YPT Barriers to Abuse Clarification for Program Requirements
 - “Q. Can a leader bring their Scouts BSA son or daughter to an opposite

gender troop activity?

- A. No. Scouts BSA program integrity requires single gender units and single gender buddy pairs.
- In our single-gender Scouts BSA Troops, program activities such as meetings and campouts (where there is an expectation the only attendees will be youth and their adult leaders) this barrier creates a safer and more productive environment by limiting participation to youth of only one gender. Other activities intended to include family members of both genders, such as award ceremonies, Courts of Honor, and fundraisers may include both male and female youth and adult visitors."
- Note: the activity that is done is important to the interpretation (as is "troop"). When conducting in-person Linked Troop (Boy/Girl Troops) meetings, *different times and/or different rooms are acceptable*. Common announcements would be okay as well, then simply adjourn to different rooms for hands-on activities. Please contact Alan.Young@scouting.org for further inquiries.

The purpose of the VOA is to provide support and guidance to maintain and grow the Venturing program. A VOA consists of a team of youth officers who are supported by advisors. It provides leadership experiences that prepare young people for their respective futures and gives them a voice to help strengthen the Venturing program. VOAs collaborate with other committees in providing training for Venturers and Advisors, programming for crews, and monthly or quarterly forums to bring together youth and Advisors. VOAs provide opportunities for adventure,

leadership, personal growth, and service (ALPS). By doing so, they serve to model best practices in programming for local crews and to provide a program resource for Venturers and Advisors throughout the council.

Patrick is the first Scouter in the Muir District to be serve as the VOA Volunteer Advisor for the Golden Gate Area Council. 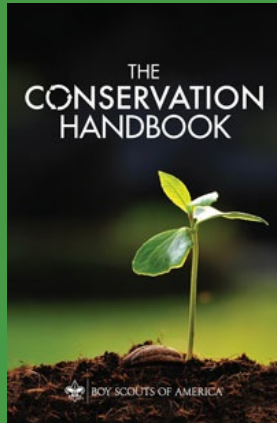
