

Muir District Director's Message on behalf of the Council

This note is for all Cubmasters, Scoutmasters, Skippers, Committee Chairs, District Committee Members, Commissioners, and other interested leaders in Muir District.

General Interests:

Updates on COVID-19—If your unit does not catch the update at the Coordinated meeting, check the summary chart at the bottom of the page at https://ggacbsa.org/covid/. The chart gives the quick and dirty version of the format of allowable activities by county while the material above the chart cites the source material guidelines to generate the chart. Twin Valley District hosted a "Scouting Out of COVID" meeting that featured Don Kubik, Chair of the council's Enterprise Risk Management Committee that was recorded and posted on YouTube at: (22) Scouting Out of Covid - YouTube .

Scouts, Are They Still Around?!—It seems odd hearing this response after you tell someone that you are involved in the Scouting program. Sometimes we are our own worst enemy at promoting the positive aspects of what we do. This summer is an opportunity to change this in a large-picture way (by all means, we should be relaying this type of information to community newspapers and other local news media) through the Summer of Service. This is a planning and tracking program for service projects done by families. This website has information to walk you through the process from ideas to recognition items: <u>Summer of Service | Boy Scouts of America (scouting.org)</u>.

Eagle Service Project Service Hours--Are your Eagle Scouts proud of their service projects? Want to help spread the word about good things that Scouts are doing for the community? We are trying to identify the number of service hours provided through these service projects. Scouts (or leaders) and Scouters may enter particulars about their projects completed in the Bay Area. Details and pin setup is on the council website at: <u>https://eagles.ggacbsa.org/eagle-projects-map/</u>. These projects may have been done decades ago. We still want the information. Thank you, Karen Hansen for listing some of the recent projects!

Friends of Scouting (FOS)—For families who can help others, we can use the help. Tax deductible donations will be used to subsidized event and activity fees (compare the cost of other summer camps to a Scouts BSA summer camp), help pay upkeep of camp properties, help to provide assistance from service centers, seeds a registration-assistance fund, and more as detailed in a 2.5-minute video at <u>FOS video</u>. Every family should have the opportunity to participate in FOS if they can. Your unit may have a campaign facilitated by a parent, a presentation facilitated by a district leader, or a letter campaign. Please contact Alan at <u>alan.young@ scouting.org</u> to tell your

preference. Secure on-line donations may be made at https://ggacbsa.org/donate/. Patches are available for pledges at the \$100 and \$240 levels and paid by the end of 2021. If you know of businesses who could help Muir District reach its \$13,000 goal, please get let us know!

National Statement on COVID-19

As always, the safety of our Scouts, volunteers, employees and communities is our top priority.

Our response to the COVID-19 pandemic continues to be informed by expertise from agencies, including the <u>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention</u>.

We expect that everyone in Scouting will follow the guidelines listed below, which are based on the CDC's guidance. In addition, we have instructed local councils to consult with their local and state health departments, as well as local chartered partners, in order to implement appropriate protocols to help keep members, volunteers, and employees safe.

- Isolate if you are sick, and do not attend any activity/meeting/event if you, anyone you live with, or anyone you have recently been around feels unwell.
- Stay at least 6 feet apart from people who do not live with you. (properly executed Scouting cohorts at council camps may be an exception).
- Avoid crowds.
- Avoid poorly ventilated indoor spaces.
- Meet outside if you can.
- Wear <u>a face covering or mask that covers your nose and mouth</u> to help protect yourself and others.
- <u>Wash your hands often</u> with soap and water. Use hand sanitizer if soap and water are not available.
- Avoid international travel if possible.
- Do not attend any activity/meeting/event if you or anyone you live with has been tested for COVID-19 or another illness and do not have the results back yet.

Units should look to their council regarding whether/how to conduct in-person meetings and activities. If in-person gatherings are permitted, be sure to follow all applicable guidelines and use your council's version of the <u>Pre-Event Medical Screening Checklist</u> before attending.

We are taking similar steps as a national organization as we continue to evaluate and adapt to the current environment with the best interests of our members, volunteers, and employees in mind.

Thank you for doing your part to ensure that young people continue to benefit from Scouting while protecting the health and safety of our families, friends, and communities.

Use These Updated Forms to Support a SAFE Scouting Experience.

Prior to any service projects, use the <u>SAFE Service Project Planning</u> <u>Checklist</u> and simplified <u>SAFE Project Tool Use Guidelines</u>.

The safety of our Scouts, volunteers, employees, and communities is our top priority. This checklist can be used for all Scouting service projects (Order of the Arrow, Distinguished Conservation Service Award, Eagle Scout, and individual or unit service). The checklist is not an added requirement for an Eagle Scout service project.

The guidelines document outlines several minimum guiding protocols that adult leaders and other volunteers must consider for Scouting service projects that include the use of tools. It is not intended to cover the use of tools integrated into advancement requirements (i.e., merit badges, handbooks, or adventures).

BSA YPT Update (March 11, 2021):

- YPT Barriers to Abuse Clarification for Program Requirements
 - "Q. Can a leader bring their Scouts BSA son or daughter to an opposite gender troop activity?
 - A. No. Scouts BSA program integrity requires single gender units and single gender buddy pairs.
 - In our single-gender Scouts BSA Troops, program activities such as meetings and campouts (where there is an expectation the only attendees will be youth and their adult leaders) this barrier creates a safer and more productive environment by limiting participation to youth of only one gender. Other activities intended to include family members of both genders, such as award ceremonies, Courts of Honor, and fundraisers may include both male and female youth and adult visitors."
- Note: the activity that is done is important to the interpretation (as is "troop"). When conducting in-person Linked Troop (Boy/Girl Troops) meetings, *different times and/or different rooms are acceptable*. Common announcements would be okay as well, then simply adjourn to different rooms for hands-on activities. Please contact Alan.Young@scouting.org for further inquiries.



The Venturing Leadership Award (VLA) honors Venturers and Venturing Advisors who have made exceptional contributions to Venturing and who exemplify the Scout Oath and Scout Law. The VLA may be awarded in the Council, Area, Region, and National levels. The Western Region covers all of Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Utah, Washington, Wyoming, and parts of Montana, Nebraska, South Dakota, and Texas as well as the countries of Japan, the Philippines, South Korea, Taiwan, and Thailand.

Patrick is the first *and will be the only* Scout/Scouter who has received 3 of the 4 VLAs (was awarded Council, Area, and Region) in the Muir District. **Note**: Areas and Regions will be reorganized into Territories by mid 2021 hence the Area and Region VLAs will be discontinued.



 - Project Name: "The Bughouse Project".
 - Project Description: Construction of an 8'x10' shed with a workbench, with individual exhibits for different types of bugs, which the school will use for after school and summer garden programs. The project included leveling the area, laying down a concrete pad, building the structure with compartments for habitats within, plus building a workbench. The bughouse fulfills the light, temperature, and size needs of the bugs, while protecting students from injuring themselves or the bugs, keeping unwanted persons out. The students will be able to view bugs in multiple stages of life, watch them grow, and visually learn. Construction included a concrete slab, plywood, 4 x 4 wood posts, 2 x 4 wood beams, Plexiglass, metal screen door, metal hinges, small plastic knobs, corrugated fiberglass roofing, nails, screws, paint, L brackets, re-bar, sill plate bolts, wood closure strips, and corrugated sealed nails.
- Collin Douglas Howison, T370, 4/15/2021.
 - Project Name: "Salvation Army-Courtyard Landscape".
 - Project Description: Soaking the ground well, using chainsaw and stump grinder to remove old, overgrown plants including Juniper bushes in the courtyard garden, adding compost, planting smaller, drought-resistant, long-lasting perennials that allow light to shine through the church's windows, and spreading mulch. The church won't have to repeatedly buy plants when some of them die. The project replaced the old irrigation system with a drip irrigation system to save water, and to prevent watering the sidewalk. The scout decided to add to his project, making the front of the church look nice, by adding compost, planting some extra plants and spreading mulch.

 - Project Name: "Auto Room Painting and Repairing".
 - Project Description: Sanding down metal countertops, painting all walls and cupboards, rearranging tools for better efficiency, applying a non-skid surface to the auto shop storage room floor to repair large cracks. The project improves the appearance, safety, and the efficiency of tool use for the auto shop room.
