

eNews Special Edition Announcing New Youth Protection Measures in 2022

GGAC Scouting Family:

Youth protection is a core value of the Golden Gate Area Council. We are pleased to update you with the latest news on California law AB 506, which adds new layers of protection to our already robust BSA Youth Protection and Barriers to Abuse policies.

All youth service organizations (e.g. church groups and sports teams) are required to meet AB 506 standards as of January, 2022. The BSA already meets some requirements with our two deep leadership policy and by having a clear process for mandatory reporting of suspected child abuse incidents.

Two of the AB 506 standards will affect all adult volunteers, all employees, and many of our families. These requirements will be added to the BSA registration process and enhance our current background check. Anyone who supervises or has direct contact with children for more than 16 hours in a month or 32 hours in a year will undergo:

- Fingerprinting
- Mandated Reporter Training from the State of California


Mandated Reporter Training will be required **in addition to** our BSA Youth Protection Training. We have previously updated you on our council's YPT policy, which requires that all registered adults 18 and over maintain YPT compliance for their entire registration period.

All California BSA councils are working together to implement these requirements consistently and in a timely fashion. Our youth members require the commitment of all adults involved in the Scouting program to keep them safe. Thank you for your dedication to this core value and for protecting our youth.

We will share further details about these new processes as they are established in the coming weeks to months at <u>California Scouting</u> and through our regular GGAC eNews updates. We appreciate your patience and assistance as we join all California Youth Service Organizations in improving youth protection.

GGAC specific requirements for YPT Certification

(https://ggacbsa.org/youth%20protection/).

All GGAC adult volunteers must be registered with the BSA and be Youth Protection Trained (YPT) to ensure that all adults know how to recognize and correctly report behaviors suspicious for grooming and abuse. On May 19, 2021 the GGAC Executive Board adopted a YPT policy to reinforce our awareness of Youth Safety. GGAC now requires that all registered adults 18 and over maintain YPT compliance *for their entire registration period*. As it is currently possible for YPT to expire during that period, this may require the adult to refresh their YPT training on an annual basis.

My Scouting sends reminders at 90, 60, and 30 days prior to YPT expiration. The BSA is also updating its YPT course materials effective June 1, 2021.

- If your YPT training is not current or will expire before December 31, 2021, you should complete the course as soon as possible.
- If you started the training, but do not complete it by May 31, 2021, you will have to retake the course.
- If your YPT training is current, you do not immediately have to take the updated course, but you will need to ensure compliance with GGAC policy.

Congratulations to the Newest Muir Eagle Scouts!

- John Thomas Knapp, T444B, 11/30/2021
 - Project Name: Moravia Park and Rec Stairway and Railing Project
 - Project Description: This project replaced the deteriorating wooden staircase railing leading down to the LaSala Trail in the Hacienda de las Flores Park. The old wood railings were too large to grab, unstable, and did not follow the elevation changes of the steps. Over 40 volunteers worked on it over two weekends. Included were railings and posts, concrete footings, a metal handrail that followed the elevation changes of the steps, and repair to unstable concrete steps. These changes made the steps safer, meeting accessibility guidelines, allowing more people to visit the gardens.
- Nathan Edward Myers, T484B, 12/07/2021
 - Project Name: Fixing Up the Street View
 - Project Description: The project created a cleaner look on the corner of Concord Blvd and Denkinger Rd., providing a more inviting place for the school to place a sign to promote the school. The project included cleaning, weeding, and leveling the area, preserving the property by laying cinderblock cornerstones. Weed blocking fabric was laid, trenches were dug, plants were put in, and bark was spread.
- Joshua David Tompkins-Nutt, T484B, 12/14/2021
 - Project Name: Big Break Bee Hotel Project
 - Project Description: This project included assembling 10 Bee Hotel kits with tubes inside, consulting with naturalists at the park, and placing the Bee Hotels away from walking paths, using straps or nails. The project aids the Solitary Bee, which is native to California, in propagating the species by providing safe places to lay their eggs. Inside the hotels, the project provided bamboo and cardboard tubes. Female Solitary Bees lay eggs in tunnels such as hollow plant stems, holes in trees, or Bee Hotels. The naturalists in the park will use the Bee Hotels to teach about Solitary Bees, life cycles, and pollination. Solitary Bees do not have a hive or a queen bee, nor do they make honey, but they are our main pollinators.
