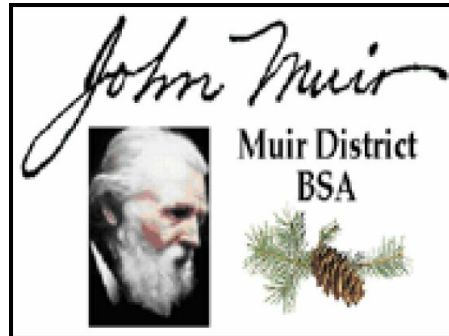

Attention Merit Badge Counselors:

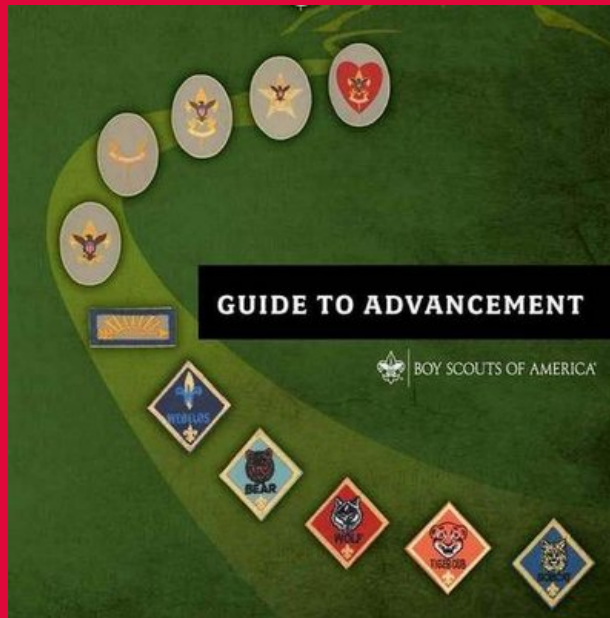
Renewals for merit badge counselors expiring on June 30 will be for 6 months as the Council has chosen to move non-unit participants to a January 1 renewal date to match the regular unit recharterers.

In order to renew, Merit Badge Counselors will need Youth Protection Training that is current through 12/31/2022 and completed AB 506 Training and LiveScan. Please see <https://californiascouting.org/> to access the required training and to find information on the LiveScan process.

UPDATE: Current COVID-19 modifications to rank requirements

and merit badge requirements have ended as of March 1, 2022.



"As always, the BSA's top priority is the health and safety of all youth participating in BSA programs. In 2020, the BSA instituted several modifications to rank requirements and merit badge requirements ("advancement modifications") to accommodate activity restrictions necessitated by COVID-19. Effective March 01, 2022, those modifications will be removed, and the standard rules for advancement and merit badges will again become effective."

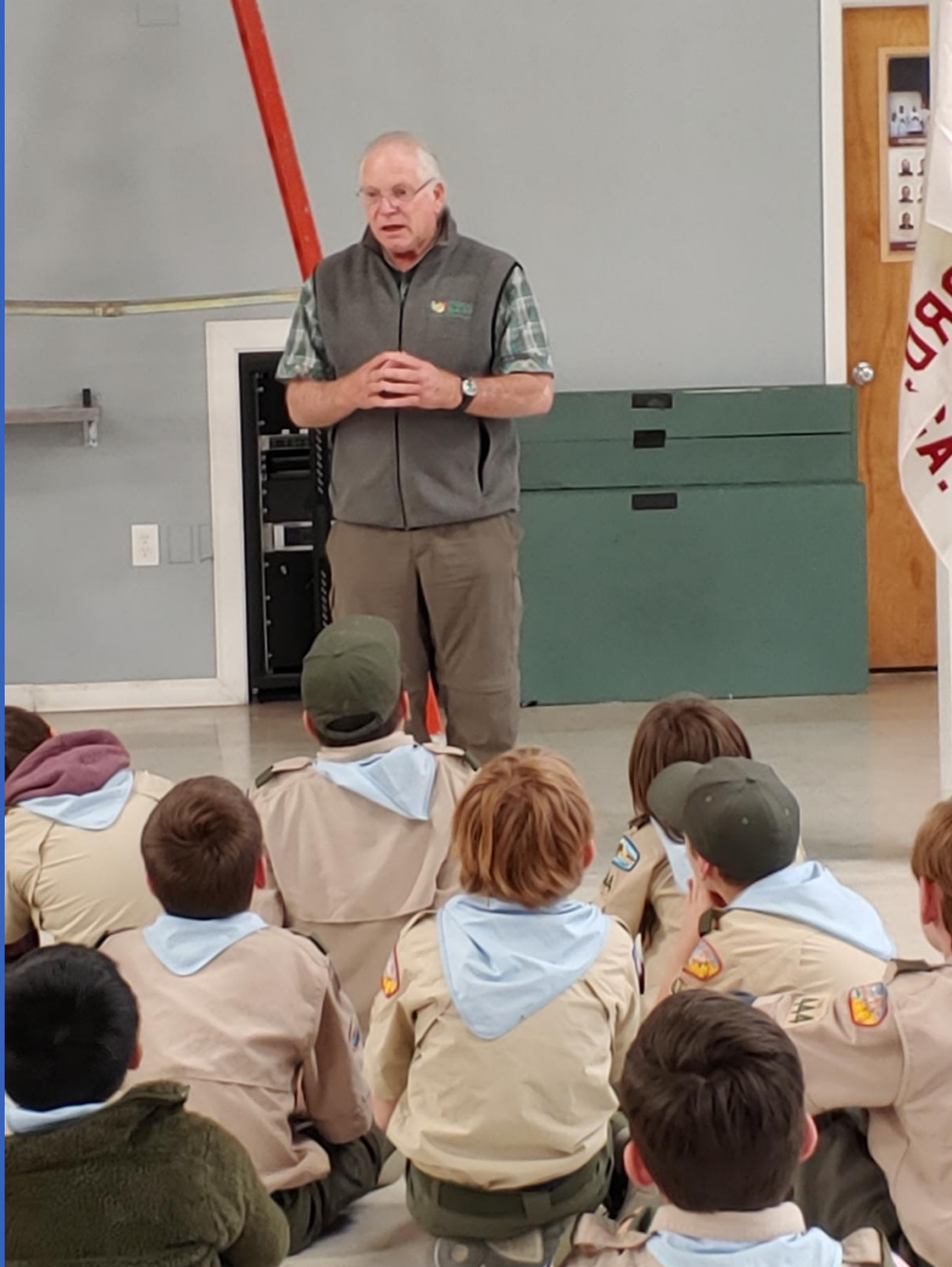

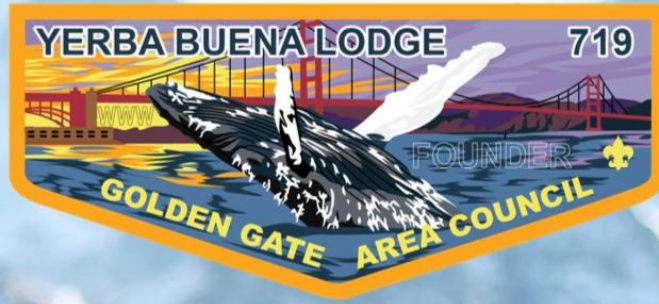

AB 506: Live Scan background check (complete ASAP if you have not already)

A Live Scan background check (the digital version of inked fingerprinting) is required for all volunteers and staff. Live Scan replaces previous background checks; all volunteers will have to complete this once.

We appreciate your patience and assistance as we join all California Youth Service Organizations in improving youth protection.

Mandated Reporter Training from the State of California (complete ASAP if you have not already)

Mandated Reporter Training is required in addition to our BSA Youth Protection Training. Volunteer leaders must complete the 2 hour training and upload their certificate at California Scouting by February 28, 2022.

AB 506 Background Information

Youth protection is a core value of the Golden Gate Area Council. The Mandated Reporter Training and Live Scan background check requirement of California law AB 506 adds layers of protection to our already robust BSA Youth Protection and Barriers to Abuse policies.

All California youth service organizations (e.g. church groups and sports teams) are required to meet AB 506 standards as of January, 2022. The BSA already meets some requirements with our two deep leadership policy and by having a clear process for mandatory reporting of suspected child abuse incidents.

Two of the AB 506 standards affect all adult volunteers, all employees, and many of our families. These requirements have been added to the BSA registration process and enhance our current background check. Anyone who supervises or has direct contact with children for more than 16 hours in a month or 32 hours in a year will undergo:

- Mandated Reporter Training from the State of California
- Fingerprinting

Congratulations to the Newest Muir Eagle Scouts!

- Aidan Moss, T484B, 5/3/2022
 - Project Name: The Andean Tapir Fund-Horse
 - Project Description: This project included building and installing three scratching posts, one hitching post, and planting shade trees for a sanctuary for wild and previously abused horses. The three scratching posts were 6 x 6 x 8 posts secured in concrete, with 4 broom parts of push brooms per post attached to serve as scratching posts. There were 6 push broom bottoms given to the beneficiary for replacements as needed. The 4th post serves as a hitching post. There were 14 horses living in 8 paddocks at the time of completion. Olive trees were planted to provide shade for the horses and any visitors. This project improves the quality of life for the rescued horses by providing safe places to scratch, and shade for them.

 - Project Beneficiary: Queen of All Saints Catholic Church, 2390 Grant Street, Concord, CA. 94520.
 - Project Location: St. Stephen's Cemetery, 2701 Monument Ct, Concord, CA. 94520.
 - Project Description: GoFundMe fundraising. By vandalism and neglect of the cemetery, though it was built in 1890 and declared a historical site by the city of Concord, it had fallen into disrepair. St. Stephen's cemetery was originally outside the city limits, but the city grew around it. It can be seen as you drive along the east end of Monument Blvd. The trash, weeds, and overgrowth along with a vandalized central cross attracted vandalism. The project replaced the central cross with a resin cross, installed two benches on concrete pads, and more than 70 yard waste bags of trash, weeds, and plant trimmings were removed. The scout showed leadership by meeting with leaders of the youth confirmation class at Queen of All Saints Catholic Church, to get the project approved as a church service project for youth in the confirmation class. Further, the cleanups of the cemetery have been approved by Queen of All Saints Church as a monthly service project option for youth in the confirmation class. The scout led scouts from T444B, T444G, and volunteers from the church on two days. The scout demonstrated leadership by making all contacts and arrangements with the companies from whom he purchased the resin cross and the benches. He coordinated with adult volunteers for transportation of materials.

Council Contingent Information

The 20th BSA National Scout Jamboree (NSJ) will be held at the **Summit Bechtel Reserve** in scenic West Virginia. This is the third NSJ to feature high-adventure outdoor activities for the *Boy Scouts of America*. Join **Scouts** from around our Council to experience white water rafting, kayaking, rock climbing, rappelling, mountain-biking, skateboarding, shooting sports, zip-line challenge courses and much more!

Dates: Friday, July 14 – Saturday, July 29, 2023 (including DC area tours & travel)
The Jamboree is onsite at the Summit Bechtel Reserve July 19 – July 28, 2023

Cost: \$3,900 (estimated) for Adults Leaders, *Scouts & Venturers*. – *Initial Deposit of \$485 Due upon registration*

Council pricing includes the BSA Jamboree fees, travel and tour expenses, NSJ hat and neckerchief, select Contingent patches, duffel bag, and 2 T-shirts. Participants are responsible for two complete BSA uniforms (required), and spending money for the tour and Jamboree.

Tour: Washington, DC and National Capital area highlights, before traveling to NSJ.

Contingent: Each Troop unit consists of 32 Scouts and 4 Leaders, so positions are limited! Currently, plans are to send 2 Boy and 1 Girl Scout troop, and 1 Crew - depending on sign ups

Eligibility: Scouts must be First Class rank, have completed 6th grade or be 12 years of age by July 19, 2023, but not have reached their 18th birthday before July 28, 2023. Additionally, young adults (18-20) are allowed to participate as 'scouts', but cannot share tents with youth. All participants must have current BSA membership, meet the minimum physical BMI standards (see Jamboree website) and complete an online NSJ Personal Health and Medical Record, and participate in pre-Jamboree troop meetings and the Contingent camping weekend.

Commitment: Troop Meetings (typically one per month starting September 2022)
Patrol Leader Council (PLC) Meetings (youth leaders in Spring 2023)
Occasional Parent Meetings (scheduled at Troop Leaders' discretion)
Contingent Camping weekend (likely Memorial Day Wknd, May 2023)
Council Payment Schedule (released in Spring 2022)

Badge

BSA announced the launch (back in November 1, 2021) of the Citizenship in Society merit badge, its newest merit badge for youth in the Scouts BSA program (ages 11-17).

BSA released this Merit Badge on November 1, 2021. Included in the release were:

- A requirements document for scouts (there will not be a pamphlet);
- A requirements document for Merit Badge Counselors; and
- A Guide for Merit Badge Counselors.

Scouts will be required to earn this badge if they do not complete all other Eagle Scout rank requirements (through a unit leader conference) except an Eagle Scout board of review by June 30, 2022. After this date, the 21 merit badges will include 14 required.

This merit badge's sessions will be group sessions set up by the council.

If anyone is interested in being a Citizenship in Society Merit Badge Counselor, they need to be:

- recommended by the Muir District Advancement Chair (Bill Spalding: spaldingwilliam62@gmail.com) who will then refer their name to the GGAC Advancement Chair,
- attend the required orientation/training conducted by GGAC,
- and after that they will meet with the GGAC Advancement Committee's subcommittee for Citizenship in Society.
- Then they will be able to counsel the badge (with a second counselor) under the system established by the GGAC Advancement Committee.

There will be training sessions for counselors which will be announced as they become available..
