

<u>Muir Scouts in Action – Troop 1351's Farm Wagon</u> <u>Restoration & Rebuilding Service Project</u>

There is an old Farm Wagon near the "Welcome to Martinez" sign on Alhambra Avenue that our scouts have been restoring and rebuilding. The Scouts in Troop 1351 started reaching out for donations back in February of 2022 and worked in stages through the spring, taking a break for most of the summer and recently completing and mounting the Farmers' Market sign in early October. They got donations of materials and expertise from members of the community to restore and rebuild the wagon to last for decades to come. Along the way they learned skills relating to carpentry, painting, iron working (getting professional help to straighten the wagon tongue), sign making and more! They are still planning to build a period-appropriate "buckboard" seat for the top but the project is otherwise done.



AB 506: Live Scan background check (complete ASAP if you have not already)

A Live Scan background check (the digital version of inked fingerprinting) is required for all volunteers and staff. Live Scan replaces previous background checks; all volunteers will have to complete this once.

We appreciate your patience and assistance as we join all California Youth Service Organizations in improving youth protection.

Mandated Reporter Training from the State of California (complete ASAP if you have not already)

Mandated Reporter Training is required in addition to our BSA Youth Protection Training. Volunteer leaders must complete the 2 hour training and upload their certificate at California Scouting by February 28, 2022.

Congratulations to the Newest Muir Eagle Scouts!

- Lucas Viray, T317, 10/25/22
 - Project Name: United Sportsman Inc. Improvement Project
 - Project Description: Proposed to rebuild sign and three shotgun racks of artificial wood but Sign was replaced before beginning of project and artificial wood was deteriorated. Lucas and beneficiary agreed to build 5 racks of redwood instead. Shotgun racks allow for guns to be stored safely. Lucas placed memorial signs honoring Tony Steers who was father of two of Lucas's teammates and a supporter of Lucas's Trap shooting team.

Katherine Ruhl, T484G, 11/1/22

- Project Name: My Little Pony Rescue Project
- Project Description: The scout sold honey from her family's bee hives, had a honey lemonade stand, and posted a gofundme page. This project built six wood-framed platforms that provide insulation and allow water to drain through layers of soil, sand, gravel, and mats, The platforms provide a safe, level surface, to help prevent the mini horses from hoof infections that can happen when horses stand and walk in mud. The scout organized the project as an assembly line, with volunteers working in pairs, moving to the next of six stalls when finished with their designated task. There was an "ax yard" where wood was cut with a saw. There an adult volunteer and assistant measured the dimensions of the stalls, cut, placed, and screwed the wood frames in place. Two volunteers used pickaxe and shovel to break up the ground in each stall. Two others shoveled sand into wheelbarrows that two more volunteers took to each stall. Two others raked the sand to fill small holes. The same process was used for the gravel. A special tool was used to pound down and level the gravel flat. The first tool broke, and there was a long delay while another was procured. On top of the flattened gravel, four volunteers worked together in each stall to place the mats onto the frames, over the gravel, completing the platform.

Parker Monson Christensen, T444B, 11/8/22

- Project Name: Tables and Seating Area for Ygnacio Valley Library
- Project Description: The project built and placed three circular, outdoor metal tables with seating attached, that are low maintenance, at the beneficiary's request. The benches are also resistant to theft, since they each weigh 300 lbs. The seating is designed for adults, and gives easy access to librarians, volunteers, and patrons. The project also constructed, sanded, and installed three redwood planter boxes, 4' x 2' x1'. The planters improve the appearance of the library.

• Andrew James Maras Wulbern, T262, 11/15/22

- Project Name: Planter Boxes for Monte Gardens Elementary
- Project Description: The project built and painted fourteen new planter boxes for the school hallways, building them larger than the existing, decaying planter boxes. Plants in good health were transplanted to the new planter boxes. The project included disposal of overgrown plants, and old planter boxes.

- Oliver John Maras Wulbern, T262, 11/15/22
 - Project Name: Clayton Valley Charter High School Ultimate Bench
 - Project Description: This project removed a splintery, four-sided bench around a tree, replacing the support structure. It involved building, painting, and installing new four-sided bench seating. It was painted to match the poles in the school hallway, making the bench more stable, reducing chances of a splinter, and extending the usefulness of the bench. The new bench will improve both function and appearance. It benefits the school by making a place for students to place their backpacks, for staff and students to rest, for weight class to use for tricep dips, as part of a video assignment or prop for video animation class, for the academy of art to print on it, or as a small club meeting spot.
- Suhas Mokkapati, T370, 11/22/22
 - Project Name: Sequoia "Garden Renovation"
 - Project Description: This project is a renovation of the Sequoia Middle School Garden, tended by the Earth Club. The renovation includes weeding, adding a new planter bed, expanding the irrigation system, and installing two 2' x 4' varnished benches. The project allows the students to grow more fruits and vegetables, and gives the students and staff who tend the garden a place to rest while gardening.

Council Contingent Information

The 20th BSA National Scout Jamboree (NSJ) will be held at the Summit Bechtel Reserve in scenic West Virginia. This is the third NSJ to feature high-adventure outdoor activities for the *Boy Scouts of America*. Join *Scouts* from around our Council to experience white water rafting, kayaking, rock climbing, rappelling, mountain-biking, skateboarding, shooting sports, zip-line challenge courses and much more!

<u>Dates</u>: Friday, July 14 – Saturday, July 29, 2023 (including DC area tours & travel)

The Jamboree is onsite at the Summit Bechtel Reserve July 19 - July 28, 2023

Cost: \$3,900 (estimated) for Adults Leaders, Scouts & Venturers. – Initial Deposit of \$485

Due upon registration

Council pricing includes the BSA Jamboree fees, travel and tour expenses, NSJ hat and neckerchief, select Contingent patches, duffel bag, and 2 T-shirts. Participants are responsible for two complete BSA uniforms (required), and spending money for the tour and Jamboree.

Tour: Washington, DC and National Capital area highlights, before traveling to NSJ.

Contingent: Each Troop unit consists of 32 Scouts and 4 Leaders, so positions are limited!

Currently, plans are to send 2 Boy and 1 Girl Scout troop, and 1 Crew - depending on sign ups

Eligibility: Scouts must be First Class rank, have completed 6th grade or be 12 years of age by July 19, 2023, but not have reached their 18th birthday before July 28, 2023. Additionally, young adults (18-20) are allowed to participate as 'scouts', but cannot share tents with youth. All participants must have current BSA membership, meet the minimum physical BMI standards (see Jamboree website) and complete an online NSJ Personal Health and Medical Record, and participate in pre-Jamboree troop meetings and the Contingent camping weekend.

Commitment: Troop Meetings (typically one per month starting September 2022)

Patrol Leader Council (PLC) Meetings (youth leaders in Spring 2023)
Occasional Parent Meetings (scheduled at Troop Leaders' discretion)
Contingent Camping weekend (likely Memorial Day Wknd, May 2023)

Council Payment Schedule (released in Spring 2022)

GGAC Process for the Citizenship in Society Merit Badge

All Scoutmasters and Committee Chairs have received an email from May or June 2022 from the Council Advancement Committee with information about the Citizenship in Society Merit Badge.

The Scoutmaster should:

- Review the Citizenship in Society requirements.
- Review the Scout's record of completed merit badges.
- Discuss cohort participation with Scout and parent. Determine readiness.
- Complete the on-line form to submit a virtual blue card: https://forms.gle/rxgjH2zU8b8aofyf8
- Ensure the parent is connected to Scout in Scoutbook as all communication and Merit Badge sign-offs will occur through Scoutbook

- Scouts BSA (Scoutmaster, Assistant Scoutmaster)
- Venturing (Crew Advisor and Associate Advisor)
- Sea Scouts BSA (all Adult Leaders)
- Exploring (Advisor and Associate Advisor)
