



District Commissioner's Note


















Philmont Scout Ranch, the Boy Scouts of America's premier High Adventure™

Youth Protection Barriers to Abuse Update – September 2023 (Clarification for Overnights)

All adults staying overnight in connection with a Scouting activity must be currently registered as an adult volunteer or an adult program participant. Adult volunteers must register in the position(s) they are serving in. For example, a Troop 123 leader **CANNOT** camp with Troop 321 unless they are also a registered adult in Troop 321. Registration as a merit badge counselor position does not meet this requirement. Please see the below excerpts from Aaron on Scouting:

"Q: Our Scouts BSA boy troop and our Scouts BSA girl troop are linked. Which troop do I need to be registered with to go on a joint campout?

A: First, each troop is a separate unit and therefore each troop/unit must provide its own two-deep leadership, meeting the leadership requirements outlined in Scouting's Barriers to Abuse. Second, as with all adult volunteers, you must be registered for the position(s) in which you are serving. If you will be attending with the girl troop, you must be registered as an adult volunteer in the girl troop. If you will be attending with the boy troop, you must be registered as an adult volunteer in

the boy troop. You can register for both troops (at no extra charge) and can select one troop for your primary registration and add the other troop as a multiple registration."

"Q: What about when Arrow of Light dens camp with Scouts BSA troops? Do the Arrow of Light parents have to register?

A: The Arrow of Light den must camp according to the specific camping guidance for Cub Scouts. That means that Cub Scout parents or legal guardians are not required to register as leaders if they are attending with their own child or legal ward. However, they must be accompanied by a registered leader any time they are with youth members of any age other than their own child or ward. As always, one-on-one contact between any adult and youth members other than their own child or ward is prohibited. Reminder, if the troop and pack to which the AOL den belongs do not share the same charter partner, the troop and AOL den must receive permission from the council to hold the joint activity (see the <u>camping section in the Guide to Safe Scouting</u> for more camping details)."

REMINDER: Mandated Reporter Training from the State of California has a 2 year expiration date.

The State of California passed AB506, which took effect on January 1, 2022. In 2023, the State updated the policy such that the Mandated Reporter training must be retaken every two years. In addition, the state has a *new higher quality version* of the training. This new training can be accessed from the California Scouting website: https://mandatedreportertraining.com/volunteers/.

The GGAC Executive Board has decided to treat this Mandated Reporter training like YPT requiring all adults to have a valid Mandated Reporter certificate for the entire registration period (through December 31, 2024). Therefore, most adults must retake Mandated Reporter training before they are eligible to recharter with their unit. **Note**: the Live Scan background check is currently NOT required every two years (supposedly just once and done).

Mandated Reporter Training is required in addition to the Scouting America Youth Protection Training. Volunteer leaders must complete the 2 hour training (or take it again before the expiration date) and upload their certificate here: https://californiascouting.org/ggac/.

AB 506: Live Scan background check (complete ASAP if you have not already)

A Live Scan background check (the digital version of inked fingerprinting) is required for all volunteers and staff. Live Scan replaces previous background checks; all volunteers will have to complete this once (if you haven't done so already).

We appreciate your patience and assistance as we join all California Youth Service Organizations in improving youth protection.

Leave No Trace Level 1 Instructor or NEW Leave No Trace Skills Course May 18-19, 2024 Camp Herms, El Cerrito, Ca

We are offering a dual track hybrid course in order to comply with changes from Leave No Trace.

- Registered Scouters (age 18 and over) may take the Level 1 (formerly Trainer) course leading to
- certification as a Level 1 Leave No Trace Instructor.

 2. Registered Scouts (First Class and at least age 12) and Scouters may take the Leave No Trace Skills course (Certificate of Completion by Leave no Trace)

Level 1 Instructor certification will require 2 hours of on-line training and preparation of a 10-15 minute presentation prior to the weekend of outdoor training at Camp Herms.

Participants should already be familiar with the seven principles of Leave No Trace. The Skills course is highly recommended for Scouts who wish to hold the *Outdoor Ethics Guide* position of responsibility and will replace req. 6 for the National Medal for Outdoor Achievement.

Leave No Trace Level 1 Instructor or NEW Leave No Trace Skills Course October 12-13, 2024 Rancho Los Mochos, Livermore, CA

We are offering a dual track hybrid course in order to comply with changes from Leave No Trace.

- Registered Scouts or Scouters (age 18 and over) may take the Level 1 (formerly Trainer) course leading to certification as a Level 1 Leave No Trace Instructor
- Registered Scouts (First Class and at least age 12) and Scouters may take the Leave No Trace Skills course (also certified by LNT.org)

Level 1 Instructor certification will require 2 hours of on line training and preparation of a presentation prior to the weekend of outdoor training at Rancho Los Mochos.

Participants should already be familiar with the seven principles of Leave No Trace. The Skills course is highly recommended for Scouts who wish to hold the *Outdoor Ethics Guide* position of responsibility and will replace req. 6 for the National Medal for Outdoor Achievement.

GGAC Process for the Citizenship in Society Merit Badge

All Scoutmasters and Committee Chairs received an email from May or June 2022 from the Council Advancement Committee with information about the Citizenship in Society Merit Badge.

The Scoutmaster should:

- Review the Citizenship in Society requirements.
- Review the Scout's record of completed merit badges.
- Discuss cohort participation with Scout and parent. Determine readiness.
- Complete the on-line form to submit a virtual blue card: https://docs.google.com/forms/d/e/1FAlpQLSca_YGcCVSBSxU-XIKSNhcmrZjr12UkrajElWcAcy2CSuRKcw/viewform
- Ensure the parent is connected to Scout in Scoutbook as all communication and Merit Badge sign-offs will occur through Scoutbook.

- Scouts BSA (Scoutmaster, Assistant Scoutmaster)

- Venturing (Crew Advisor and Associate Advisor)
- Sea Scouts BSA (all Adult Leaders)
- Exploring (Advisor and Associate Advisor)
